### Political snapshot

On June 27th, 2018 the decision of Janus v. AFSCME, a landmark Supreme Court case, changed the laws surrounding unions of every kind. Prior to the Janus decision, everyone who worked at a job covered by a union had to pay fair share fees in exchange for the union representing them- negotiating the contract and defending them in court, among other things. Under Janus, fair share fees were ruled unconstitutional, but unions still have to protect people regardless of whether or not they pay. This is a tactic commonly used to destroy unions by discouraging membership and bankrupting them. You can help combat this by joining your union when you become a teacher and informing other future teachers on what being a part of your union means!
