

IEA SCORE Grant Recipients September 2021

Bellwood Education Association will implement a project that bridges awareness and understanding of youth (ages 10 -12), and elders (ages 75 - 100) in the community.

Bloom Township Education Association will support Read & Feed, a program that provides students with care packages and free books to start their own home library.

Bloomington Education Association will help to build Little Free Libraries throughout the community where access to literacy is limited, targeting neighborhoods that serve the most vulnerable elementary buildings.

Breese Elementary District 12 will fund a classroom service project for a local assisted living facility.

Carbondale Education Association will partner with Women for Change to initiate an after-school reading program during the 2021-2022 school year with a mission to decrease the achievement gap created by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Carbondale High School Education Association will partner with the Boys & Girls Club to conduct community activities related to kindness, gratitude, and giving back to others.

Clinton Education Association will help support the Good Cemeterian Project, a project that has students research a local veteran, create a research project, and clean the veteran's grave using a specialized cleaner. In addition, an online map and database using high resolution images will also be created.

Congerville Eureka Goodfield Education Association will help fund holiday-themed science stations at Santa's Workshop, an annual high school service event.

Cumberland Education Support Professionals will furnish supplies for the activity department at a local nursing facility.

Giant City Education Association will support a Family STEAM Night, a hands-on event with multiple stations and events manned by volunteers who will host experiments, crafts, explorations and demonstrations in the areas of science, technology, engineering, art and math.
