Leaders for Just Schools: An Overview

- The cohorts will be hybrid delivery, with virtual activities, and in person if conditions allow. Each cohort will meet one Saturday morning per quarter for training and leadership development over the course of the school year.
- Topics will include the Six Layers of Racism, Implicit Bias, Microaggressions as well Creating Strong Relationships with Students and the Community.

- Participants will have the chance to work with educational leaders in their area and around the state.
- Cohort members who successfully complete the program will receive a micro credential and will have the opportunity to earn an organizing stipend to continue the work.
