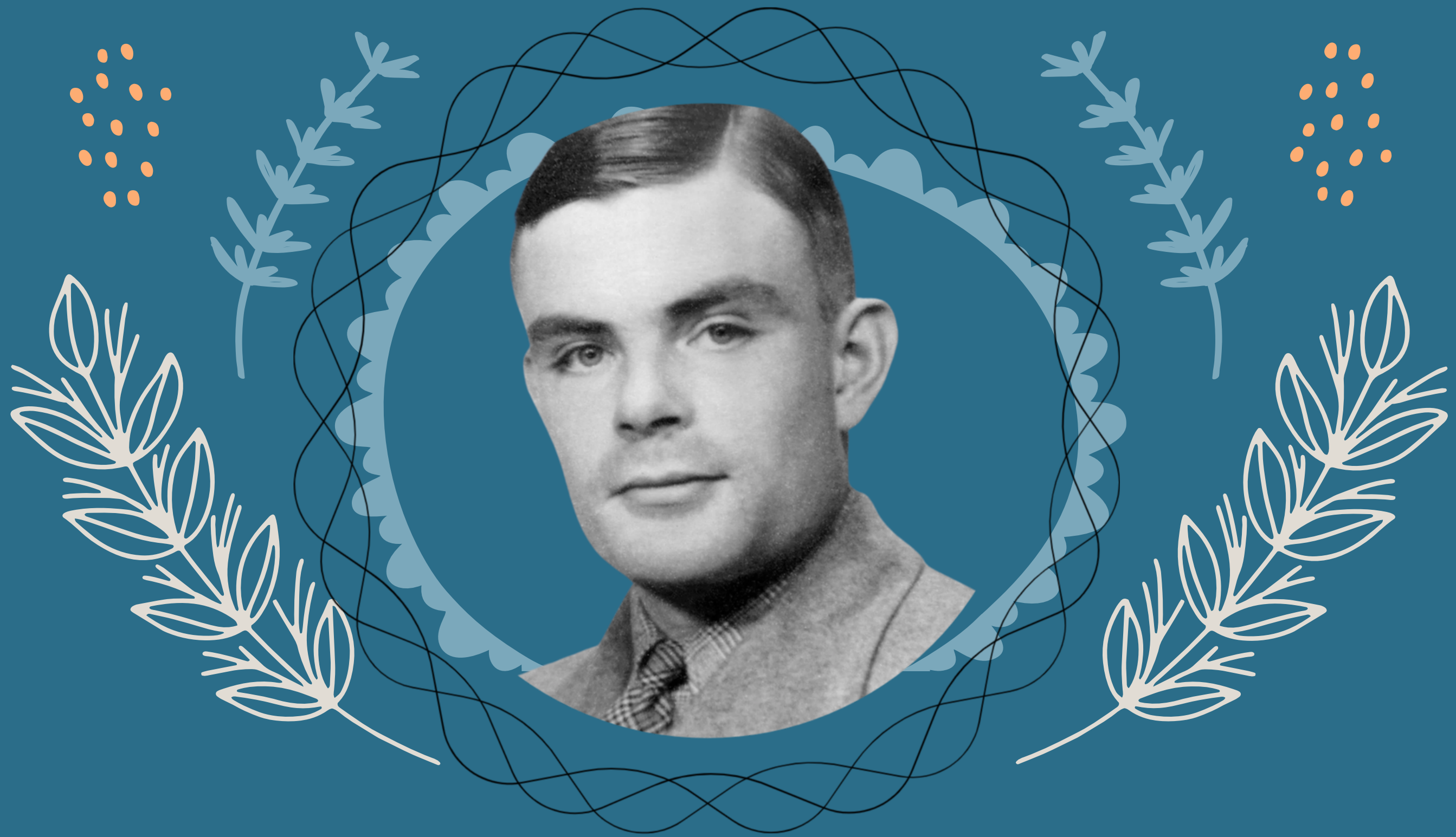


LGBTQ+ HERO



ALAN TURING

Gay British Mathematician
& Computer Scientist

June 23, 1912—June 7, 1954



Often referred to as the “father of computer science and artificial intelligence,” Turing was hailed as a war hero and granted an honor by King George VI at the end of the WWII for helping to defeat the Nazis. Despite this, however, he died as a disgraced “criminal” — simply for being a gay man. Starting in 2021, on what would have been his 109th birthday, Turing has been featured on the British £50 bank notes.
